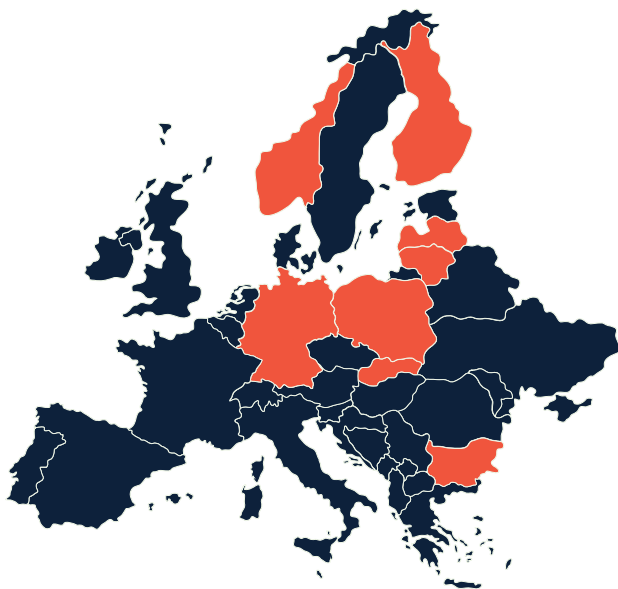

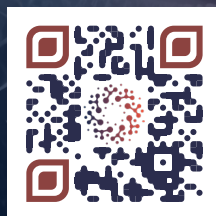

Background

The DeCrises project emerges in response to the European Union's commitment to achieving carbon neutrality by 2050, amid growing complexities from global crises such as the COVID-19 pandemic and geopolitical tensions.
